Behaviors and Beliefs in Daily Life	<ul> <li>91% of respondents had not used illegal drugs in the three months before the survey.</li> <li>58%, the greatest response set, indicated that parents are very influential in their lives.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>70% said that it is okay to break the law without hurting anybody.</li> <li>30% were legally drunk at some time in the three months before the survey.</li> <li>75% of respondents had lied to an adult.</li> <li>70% had lied to a friend or peer in the past three months.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Living with a high degree of integrity is a desirable condition for the respondents. This seems discordant with reported behavior with regard to lying.</li> <li>In the reported use of pornography, alcohol, and illegal drugs, gambling, and attempts to hurt someone there are minimal differences between Evangelicals and non-Evangelicals.</li> </ul>
Religious Background and Practice	<ul> <li>88% indicate having made a personal commitment to Jesus Christ</li> <li>84% report that their faith is important in their lives.</li> <li>81% think the Bible provides indisputable moral truth.</li> <li>79% said that the Bible provides absolute moral truths that are the same for all people in all situations.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>31% of evangelical youth agreed that God is no longer personally involved in the lives of humans.</li> <li>31% of evangelical youth think that all religions teach equally valid truths.</li> <li>30% belief in reincarnation.</li> <li>78% think that truth can be contradictorily defined and still be correct.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Female respondents are more likely than males to believe the Bible provides practical standards for living, but they are also more likely to define truth and morals in pragmatic and relativistic terms.</li> <li>There is a seeming disconnect between theory and practical theology. For example, 81% say that good people go to heaven, but 66% say that those who do not accept Jesus go to hell.</li> </ul>
Identity	53% report being very satisfied with their lives.	24% had suicidal thoughts in the three months before the survey.	Non-evangelicals were more likely to have had suicidal thoughts than were evangelicals.
