## Spiritual State of the World's Children: Summary Table, Zimbabwe



Notes: Surveys were administered in randomly selected accessible schools. Inaccessible schools are those in conflict zones or areas of extremely low population, and those that cannot be reached by public transportation. Reported respondents are those who participated in the survey and answered the question. Not all participants answered

all questions. The composition of the sample set—3,876 students aged about 13 to 18, with 67% rural and 61% aged 16 or older (population density and gender are proportional to the national population distribution)—indicates a skew towards rural and older subjects' attitudes. Data was collected from May to August 2010. SSWC was completed in October 2010 for OneHope by the Metadigm Group.

Identity	<ul> <li>73% of respondents report that they are somewhat or very satisfied with their lives.</li> <li>77% report that having a close relationship with God is very important in their futures.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>21% of subjects report suicidal thoughts in the three months before the survey. Rural youth report so significantly more often than their peers.</li> <li>13% are not at all satisfied with their lives.</li> </ul>	60% believe that a full and satisfying life is not possible without the pursuit of spiritual maturity.
