Spiritual State of the World's Children: Summary Table, Ethiopia



Notes: Surveys were administered in randomly selected accessible schools. Inaccessible schools were those in conflict zones or areas of extremely low population, those where access was denied, and those that could not be reached by public transportation. Reported respondents are those who chose to participate and answered a particular question. Not all participants answered all questions. The composition of the sample set—3,576 students aged 13 to over 18 with 80% age 16 and over, 71% rural, and 58% male—indicates a skew toward older, rural, and male attitudes. Data was collected from April to July 2010. SSWC was completed in September 2010 for OneHope by the Metadigm Group.
