Spiritual State of the World's Children: Summary Table, Mexico



Notes: Surveys were administered in randomly selected accessible schools. Inaccessible schools are those in conflict zones or areas of extremely low population, and those that cannot be reached by public transportation. Reported respondents are those who participated in the survey and answered the question. Not all participants answered all questions. The composition of the sample set—4,359 students aged about 13 to 18, with 55% female (population density and gender are proportional to the national population distribution)—indicates a skew towards female attitudes. Data was collected from October 2008 to July 2009. SSWC was completed in September 2009 for OneHope by the Metadigm Group.

The most indicated desirable conditions for the future are good health and close friendships.
