Family Relationships and Perspectives	 76% of respondents sometimes or frequently talk to their mothers about personal concerns. 56% sometimes or frequently talk to their fathers about personal concerns. 47% report that they are very close to their mothers. 26% report that they are very close to their fathers. 49% said that home is where they feel safe and loved. Younger students were more likely to report this. 68% said that their family experience has been positive. The Bible and parents were the greatest reported influences in the respondents' lives. 	 71% lied to a friend or peer in the three months prior to the survey. 62% lied to a parent, teacher, or an adult. 45% watched a pornographic movie. 31% gambled. 24% stole. 48% say it's ok to break the law if no one is hurt. 	 Males reported significantly more often than females that they had viewed pornography, gotten drunk, or gambled. And they more often reported using drugs and tobacco and trying to physically hurt someone. 69% could recall a time when their religious beliefs changed their behavior. But 64% said that whatever works in their lives is morally right.
Religious Background and Practice	 75% of respondents indicated that a close relationship with God is very important to their futures. 75% believe that prayer can be effective in their lives. 73% said that Jesus was born to a virgin. 72% have made a personal commitment to Jesus that is still relevant in their lives. 81% agree that forgiveness of sins is only possible through faith in Jesus Christ. 	 79% are not sure or do not believe God exists. 68% believe all religions pray to the same God. 65% say a good person can earn a place in heaven. 63% believe that moral truth can mean different things and no one can be positive they know it. 48% believe Jesus did not physically return to life. 45% believe some sins can never be forgiven. 33% do not know what will happen after they die. Identity	 54% of respondents said it is very important in their futures that they live with a high degree of integrity. 46% report that they are very satisfied with their lives. 	 17% of respondents had suicidal thoughts in the three months before the survey. 12% are not at all satisfied with their lives. 	 Nearly three quarters of all respondents have some or a lot of desire for purpose in their lives.
