Spiritual State of the World's Children: Summary Table, Nigeria



Notes: Surveys were administered in randomly selected accessible schools. Inaccessible schools are those in conflict zones or areas of extremely low population, and those that cannot be reached by public transportation. Reported respondents are those who participated in the survey and answered the question. Not all participants answered all questions. The composition of the sample set is 3,412 students aged about 13 to 18 (population density and gender are proportional to the national population distribution). Data was collected from October 2007 to February 2008. SSWC was completed in June 2008 for OneHope by the Metadigm Group.
