In all cases, reported respondents are those who participated in the survey and answered the question. Not all participants answered all questions. Behaviors and Beliefs in Daily Life	<ul> <li>89% did not use an illegal drug in the three months before the survey was administered.</li> <li>88% did not use tobacco.</li> <li>83% had not been legally drunk.</li> <li>82% did not steal.</li> <li>Parents were the greatest reported influence in respondent's lives.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>59% believe that lying is sometimes necessary.</li> <li>49% lied to a friend or peer in the three months prior to the survey.</li> <li>45% lied to a parent, teacher, or an adult.</li> <li>43% viewed a pornographic magazine.</li> <li>25% gambled.</li> <li>46% say it's ok to break the law if no one is hurt.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Males were more likely than females to have gambled or to have tried to hurt someone. I</li> <li>It is of interest that the incidence of cheating, at 27%, is so much lower than that of lying.</li> <li>59% could recall a time when their religious beliefs affected their behavior. Religious Background and Practice	<ul> <li>83% said that God created the universe and still rules.</li> <li>79% said forgiveness for sin comes only through faith in Jesus.</li> <li>79% believe in the virgin birth of Jesus.</li> <li>78% believe that prayer can be effective.</li> <li>77% of respondents indicated that a close relationship with God is very important to their futures.</li> <li>69% agree that the Bible provides absolute moral truths that are the same for all people in all situations.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>48% are not sure if God exists.</li> <li>46% do not believe in Jesus' physical resurrection.</li> <li>39% believe that the idea of sin is outdated.</li> <li>43% believe in reincarnation.</li> <li>65% believe that all faiths pray to the same God.</li> <li>73% said that the Holy Spirit is not a living being.</li> <li>70% believe that ghosts may or do exist.</li> <li>63% said that moral truth means different things to different people.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Non-Christian faiths with a lot of influence on respondents follow: 10% Buddhism, 10% new age, 9% Islam, 11% indigenous faith or ancestor worship, 6% Hinduism, and 12% other.</li> <li>Females were 11% more likely to report that they would go to heaven because they accepted Jesus and 11% more likely to be Protestant.</li> <li>74% had made a personal commitment to Jesus. But only 42% believe they will go to heaven because they accepted Him.</li> </ul>
Identity	<ul> <li>52% of respondents report that they are very satisfied with their lives.</li> <li>44% reported that living with a high degree of integrity is very important to their futures.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>23% of respondents had suicidal thoughts in the three months before the survey.</li> <li>12% report that they are not at all satisfied with their lives.</li> </ul>	• Rural respondents were significantly more likely than their urban counterparts to have considered suicide.
