## Spiritual State of the World's Children: Summary Table, USA, African American Youth

Notes: Surveys were administered online. African Americans composed 17.8% of the total USA sample. The composition of the sample set—911 youth aged 13 to 18, with 62% 16 to 18 and 59% female—indicates a skew towards older and female attitudes. Data was collected from August to October 2010. SSWC was completed in January 2011 for OneHope by the Metadigm Group.

Identity	<ul> <li>90% of respondents report that they are somewhat or very satisfied with their lives.</li> <li>47% report that having a close relationship with God is very important in their futures.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>9% of subjects report suicidal thoughts in the three months before the survey.</li> <li>10% are not at all or not too satisfied with their lives.</li> </ul>	• A clear purpose for living and a high degree of integrity are among the most desired condition for participants' futures.
